- * This is the 23rd meeting between Tennessee State and Austin Peay
- * Tennessee State leads the series 13-9
- * The Tigers held on for a 26-24 Homecoming win in 2019 at Nissan Stadium
- * Tennessee State is 4-7 versus the Governors in Clarksville
- * Spring 2021 Sgt. York Standings: Tennessee Tech 1-0, UT Martin 0-0, Tennessee State 0-0, Austin Peay 0-1

Last Meeting

- * Tennessee State brought down the undefeated Governors, 26-24, for its first Ohio Valley Conference win of the year.
- * Sophomore kicker Antonio Zita scored all nine points for TSU in the first half with field goals from 43, 22 and 36 yards.
- * Zita connected on a career long 50 yarder to go along with a pair of touchdown passes from Cameron Rosendahl to Steven Newbold to reach their final point total.
- * The Defense held the Gobs in check after allowing a touchdown on the opening drive of the second half.
- * Freshman Josh Green intercepted a pass in the end zone late in the fourth quarter to go along with two missed APSU field goals to solidify the victory.
- * Senior wide receiver Chris Rowland, finished the night with 12 receptions for 113 yards.

Head Coach Rod Reed

- * Coach Reed is in his 11th season at the helm of the Tigers and holds a 56-56 record.
- * Only two coaches have produced more wins at TSU.
- * John Merritt claimed 174 victories in his 20 years (1963-83) for a .806 winning percentage (174-35-7), while Harry Kean spent 10 years in charge of TSU from 1944-54 and compiled a 93-15-3 record (.838).
- * TSU is 9-1 in season openers under Rod Reed, including a 17-10 win at FBS opponent Georgia State in 2017.
- * The lone opening day loss came at the hands of Bethune-Cookman, 12-9, at the John Merritt Classic in 2013.

Tennessee State

- The Tigers are coming off a 3-9 season, 2-6 in the OVC.
- The offense will look to replace eight starters, including quarterback Cameron Rosendahl, wide receivers Chris Rowland and Steven Newbold, as well as three offensive linemen, led by the Chicago Bears 7th round selection Lachavious Simmons.
- Rosendahl set a new TSU record in completions with 241 and finished second passing yards (3,023) and completion percentage (61.2).
- Rowland, a unanimous All-American selection and the Black College Hall of Fame Deacon Jones Player of the Year, caught 104 passes for 1,437 yards and was the only player in all of DI and DII to score a touchdown rushing, receiving, on a punt return and kickoff return.
- Newbold added 59 catches for 823 yards and six touchdowns.
- Junior running back Shawn McColley is the top returning rusher 37 214 yards on 37 carries.
- McColley will look to step into the role Te'kendrick Roberson held as the focus back.
- Roberson rushed for 750 yards on 176 touches and was followed by Seth Rowland who had 75 attempts for 427 yards.
- Josh Green and Terray Jones are coming off freshmen All-American campaigns and are anticipated to continue their success.
- Green will be joined in the defensive backfield by BOXTOROW Preseason All-American Nick Harper Jr.
- TSU returns a pair of Preseason All-OVC special teamers in kicker Antonio Zita and punter Kaleb Mosely.

Series Information: This is the 23rd meeting with the Tigers leading the series, 13-9. The teams first met in 1988, a 16-12 victory for the squad from Clarksville. TSU earned its first win in the series a year later, 38-10. The Gobs snapped the Tigers five game win streak in the series in 2017 with a 21-17 win at Nissan Stadium. The prior 11 meetings had run in streaks for the teams. TSU won a trio of games from 1996-2008, only to see the Governors reel off three of their own from 2009-11. The Tigers then went on a five game streak, including a last second 41-40 win in Clarksville in 2016. The Big Blue pulled off a thrilling 26-24 Homecoming win in 2019 stopping APSUs two game run.

Long Time Coming

- The game versus Austin Peay marks the first game for Tennessee State in 463 days.
- The Tigers last played on Nov. 23, 2019, in Cookeville, Tenn.
- TSU earned a 37-27 win at Tennessee Tech.
- The Ohio Valley Conference postponed all fall sports on Aug. 14 due to concerns and the uncertainty surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The Tigers were scheduled to play on Sunday, Feb. 21 against Jacksonville State but a winter storm through the middle Tennessee area forced postponement delaying the 2021 spring season.

Scoring Streak

- Tennessee State has scored a point in 70 consecutive games.
- The last time the Tigers were shutout was on Nov. 2, 2013 at Eastern Kentucky (44-0)
- The streak is the second longest current streak in the OVC.
- Jacksonville State has scored in 95 consecutive games dating back to a 23-0 loss at Florida on Nov. 17, 2012.
- The longest all-time streak at the FCS level belongs to Montana with 406 dating back to 1989.

The Hole

- Tennessee State will play all of its home games this spring in Hale Stadium.
- TSU is one of the few teams in the nation that splits games between two home sites.
- This marks the first season since 1998 to play a full season in "the Hole".
- The Tigers used the on-campus stadium from 1953-1998 before moving into Nissan Stadium in 1999.
- TSU returned to Hale in 2012 and has gone 8-8 since then.
- The Big Blue dropped all four games in Hale Stadium in 2019.
- In total, TSU is 181-65-5 at home all-time.

Welcome Back

- Antonio Zita returns for his third season with the Tigers after deciding to transfer to NCAA D-II West Florida.
- Zita comes back after one semester away from Tennessee State.
- The junior regained his honor as a Preseason All-OVC selection.
- As a sophomore, the kicker set a single season program record with 20 field goals.
- The mark also tied for fifth best in OVC history.
- Zita finished 2019 with a .833 field goal percentage (20-for-24), which led the OVC and ranked sixth in the FCS.
- Zita earned an honorable mention spot on the HERO Sports Sophomore All-America team.

Pushing 50

- Kaleb Mosley was named to the Preseason All-OVC team after leading the conference in 2019 with a 42.2 yards per punt average.
- Mosley was named as one of 22 candidates on the Augusta Sports Council preseason FCS Punter of the Year Award watch list.
- The list is based on the 2019 watch list, 2019 honors and 2020 preseason recognition.
- Mosley recorded punts of 50-plus yards in seven consecutive games dating back to the final game of the 2018 season through the first six games of 2019.
- The junior booted a 57 yard punt at Jacksonville State in the final game of the streak, before missing the next two games due to surgery.
- After his return, Mosley closed the season with a punt of 45 or more yards over the final four games, including a 58-yard boot at UT Martin.
- The punt was the third longest of his career, behind a 64-yarder against Mississippi Valley State (8-31-19) and a 61-yarder at Eastern Kentucky (9-28-19).
- The 64 yard punt is the eighth longest in program history.

Condensed Schedule

- Due to the pandemic the 2020 season was reduced to a conference only spring season.
- The schedule consists of a seven game round robin facing each team in the OVC with the exception of Eastern Kentucky.
- The Colonels opted out after playing nine games in the fall.
- In 2018, the Tigers played just nine games due to two cancellations due to weather.
- The Southern Heritage Classic versus Jackson State was cancelled due to lightning.
- The following week, the Tigers game at Hampton was cancelled due to Hurricane Florence.
- The seven game slate is the smallest for TSU since 1957.
- The Big Blue under the direction of Howard Gentry finished the '57 campaign at 5-0-1.

Sustaining the Drive

- In the first season under offensive coordinator Shannon Harris the Tigers embarked on 50 scoring drives in 2019.
- Just under half of those drives went for 70 yards or more.
- The Big Blue made the long drives count as 16 of the 22 from 70-plus went for touchdowns.
- The highest amount of scoring drives (16) ranged between 70-79 yards.
- Four went for 80-89 yards while two traveled 90-99.
- Another 13 of the 50 drives were over 50 yards (four from 50-59, nine from 60-69).
- The offense had 35 of the 50 drives cover half the field.

Location Breakdown

- The 2021 Tigers are represented by 11 states.
- Of the 91 players on the squad, 33 hail from Tennessee, while 19 come from Florida and 18 from Georgia.
- Alabama is represented by eight players, while four are from Illinois and two each from Mississippi, Texas and Pennsylvania.
- Hawaii and Virginia each have one athlete.

TSU vs. HBCUs

- The 2021 spring season will be the first time Tennessee State has not faced a Historically Black College and University (HBCU).
- Tennessee State University holds a 399-143-19 record against other HBCUs, good for a .728 winning percentage.
- The Tigers finished 1-2 versus HBCUs in 2019.
- Since taking over in 2010, Rod Reed holds a 22-6 against HBCUs for a winning percentage of .786.
- TSU's most wins against D-I HBCU opponents are: Florida A&M (29), Jackson State (28) and Southern (27).

- Harris will be joined by tight ends coach Antonio Bradford.
- First year defensive coordinator Justin Roberts will also be in the booth.
- Defensive backs coach Ahmaad Smith will join Roberts upstairs.
- Joining Head Coach Rod Reed on the sidelines will be offensive line coach Russ Ehrenfeld, running backs coach Kevin Mashack, wide receiver coach Andrew Bather, defensive line coach Ken Amato and linebackers coach Rico Council.
- Council also holds the position of Special Teams coordinator.
- Head Strength and Conditioning coach, Tyler Miles will be on the sideline and hold the role of "get back" coach.

Having A Voice

- Junior Raymond Horton was selected to serve on the NCAA Division I Football Oversight Committee Student-Athlete Connection Group.
- The defensive lineman is one of two student-athletes from the Ohio Valley Conference.
- The group's goal is to gather broad-based feedback from D-I football student-athletes on multiple issues. The topics include COVID-19 health and safety measures, transfer issues, name, image and likeness topics and social justice issues.
- The committee will meet quarterly to discuss issues and provide feedback.
- Horton is joined by Tennessee Tech's Seth Carlisle and Eastern Illinois head coach Adam Cushing, who is the FCS level head coach representative.

Quoting Coach Rod Reed

Thoughts on team not being able to play last week, but getting geared up for this week

- It was tough on our kids not being able to play last week, but you know the conditions here and several other places in our area. We had an unplayable surface. We still had an inch of ice on the field Sunday afternoon, so it was definitely a disappointment not being able to play, but we look forward to getting started this week against a really talented football team in Austin Peay.

Playing against a team who did get to play last week, and thoughts on what you saw

- I thought they were a really, really physical football team. Just watching the game, they dominated in yardage. They had some miscues and three or four turnovers that really set them back. They showed some explosiveness on offense with (DeAngelo) Wilson going deep and Baniko (Harley) catching a touchdown. Their front on both sides are really physical. They pounded the ball and the running backs ran the ball well. They have three guys they rotate in there.

- Watching film, you saw some early-season rust. The good thing for them is that they have a game under the belt, and they say you make your biggest jump between your first and second week. They'll most likely have a lot of those miscues cleaned up. They have a young dynamic quarterback, so we have our work cut out for us.

- Their defense is stout. We watch Cordell run around up there. They're physical. We have our work cut out for us and we're looking forward to it.

Why does TSU and APSU always play neck and neck?

- I think it has a lot to do with proximity. A lot of guys that are at Peay are from the Middle Tennessee area. It's about bragging rights. You have the Sargent York Trophy out there. We always talk about winning the state of Tennessee. There are also a lot of recruiting wars going on there. There's a lot involved in this game and it's become a huge rivalry game for us. There's a lot of pride on the line.

On the Offense

- I thought our offensive line looked pretty good until I saw Austin Peay's defense. We'll see how they match up. I feel good about our offensive line. Coach (Russ) Ehrenfeld does a great job with those guys year in and year out. They do throw a lot of things to catch you off balance. They're really physical up front. It'll be a good test for our offensive line to block those guys.

In terms of offensive scheme, do you lean towards running game complimenting your passing game or vice versa?

- It's a little give and take there. You've got to be able to take what the defense gives you. Looking at Austin Peay, they want to get you behind the chains. They put a lot of guys in the box. They'll force you to try and throw the ball. They have good corners that stick to guys like glue. We have to establish the run game and not get behind the sticks on first down. Once you get behind the sticks, they can be really creative in what they do.

On the defense

- We have to be physical up front. Without a question they were a physical football team. They pounded it a lot and I think if not for the turnovers that could've been a different game. Tennessee Tech dominated in time of possession mostly because of turnovers. They missed a couple of deep balls that could've been big plays for them. We've got to play well in the secondary and we have to stay disciplined. Harley and Wilson are explosive. They have a lot of weapons that are disposable and control the game on both fronts.

What's your message to the team

- One play at a time. One game at a time and it starts with Austin Peay. Guys have to mentally and physically prepared to play. We've been coaching that up. The good thing is, we got to see some film. You have an idea of what you're going to see. Early in the season, things tend to change up a little bit. I'm sure they saw some things on film they want to change up. We just have to continue to prepare the way we have been and now we have a little bit more ammunition with the film we were able to see. I know they're well coached. Anytime you have a dual-threat quarterback you have an opportunity.

You haven't played in 15-16 months where the Gobs have played seven since your last.

- It'll be a little pressure. It is a challenge. Anytime you have guys with game experience on the field, and we have to play some young guys this year, it's going to be an advantage for APSU. We've prepared for what we saw on film. Our guys have done a tremendous job with the limited fall ball we've had. Our guys have been bought in and locked in. We just have to the coaching we've received to the field and make game time adjustments when we need to make them.

What's it liked to have an experienced specialist especially if teams' offenses or defenses struggle early on.

- It's great to have a guy that you have confidence in who can put it through the uprights or punt it where you want to punt it. We also have Jimmy Lowery and Kaleb Mosley. We feel good about our kicking game.

- Adams ranks second at Tennessee State in career passing yards with 8,653.
- The Gulfport, Miss., native tossed a TSU single season best 30 touchdowns in 1980 and 75 in his career (1977-80).
- Adams was drafted by the San Francisco 49ers in the 12th round of the 1981 NFL Draft.
- He continued his professional career by playing three seasons in the Canadian Football League with the Saskatchewan Roughriders, Toronto Argonauts and Ottawa Rough Riders.
- Six TSU greats have been previously inducted. Eldridge Dickey and Claude Humphrey entered in 2012, Joe Gilliam, Jr., Ed 'Too Tall' Jones and John Merritt were enshrined in 2013 and Richard Dent was the latest entrant in 2015.

Rod Reed enters his eighth season at the helm of the Tennessee State football program after being named head coach on December 18, 2009. He served as the associate head coach and defensive coordinator during the 2009 season.

Reed experienced immediate success as a head coach, leading the Tigers to a win in his debut game, 27-14, over Alabama A&M on Sept. 4, 2010 in the John Merritt Classic. He also broke an eight-game losing streak to Florida A&M, downing the Rattlers, 29-18, in the Atlanta Classic. Reed coached six players to All-OVC Teams including safety Eugene Clifford who also was a Sports Network, Phil Steele and BOXTOROW All-American.

The Tigers increased their win total in their second season under Reed and finished the 2011 season on a hot streak, winning four of their last six games. The stretch included a, 42-40, upset win at No. 19 ranked Tennessee Tech on Oct. 15. Reed produced even more All-OVC players in year two, as seven made postseason squads. Two more defenders garnered All-American honors under Reed's tutelage in linebacker Rico Council and Joseph Wylie. He also helped Lamar Divens and Sidney Tarver ink NFL contracts.

The Big Blue continued its success in 2012 by rattling off seven straight victories to open the season. The Tigers finished the year with an 8-3 record, its best since 2001. The performance earned TSU HBCU Program of the Year honors by HBCU Huddle. Several players earned postseason accolades including running back Trabis Ward who was named to the College Sports All-American Team after running for 1,460 yards and 15 touchdowns. Three more Tigers were Sheridan All-Americans including Sherman Carter who signed an NFL deal with fellow offensive lineman Rogers Gaines following suit.

Reed turned in his finest season to date in 2013, as the Tigers finished 10-4 and won a FCS Playoff Game for the first time since 1986. It capped an impressive run in which Reed improved his club's win total by at least two in each of his first four campaigns. TSU won its first HBCU National Championship since 1982 and the team's shutout win over Butler in the first round of the playoffs was the first victory for the OVC in post-season play in nearly 30 years. A school record 12 Tigers were chosen to the league's all-conference teams at season's end and Kadeem Edwards (143rd) and Demetrius Rhaney (250th) were selected in the NFL Draft.

In 2014, Reed's defense ranked inside the top-10 for the third

straight season. Middle linebacker Nick Thrasher tallied 128 stops on the season, which was sixth-most in a single-season in school history and the highest total for a Tiger since 1991. Thrasher also moved up to second-place in tackles in the TSU record book over the course of the season, finishing with 358. Quarterback Mike German threw for 2,846 yards on the year, helping him break the 34 year old school-mark with 8,664 career yards.

After breaking a streak of three consecutive non-losing seasons in 2015, the Tigers bounced back to finish 7-4 in 2016. TSU re-emerged as one of the top teams in the OVC under Reed with nine all-conference players and six All-Americans. The offense led the OVC in points scored and finished second in total offense. Cornerback Ezra Robinson and offensive lineman Jessamen Dunker both earned First Team All-OVC selections, All-American status and were invited to play in the Reese's Senior Bowl. The duo also participated in the NFL combine and signed free agent contracts.

Reed has coached a total of 28 All-Americans and 62 All-OVC Players in his seven seasons as a head coach and has staked a 43-37 record.

He began coaching at TSU in 2003 and served as the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach. At the conclusion of the season in which Reed returned to the TSU sideline, the Tigers led the OVC in total defense for the first time in school history. The defense accomplished the same feat in 2008 finishing at the top of the OVC in total defense.

A keen recruiter as an assistant, Reed was responsible for bringing several notable key players into the TSU program. Reed is noted for recruiting Javarris Williams (2009 seven-round draft pick, Kansas City Chiefs), Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie (2008 first-round draft pick, Arizona Cardinals), Shaun Richardson, Lamar Divens (Baltimore Ravens, 2008) and Cornelius Lewis. He has also coached All-America and professional player, Jamar Landrom (Jacksonville Jaguars).

Reed was a four-year letter winner for the TSU Tigers from 1984 - 1988. He capped off his career by being named Sheridan All-America his senior season. He set the Tiger record for career tackles from his linebacker slot and in 1987, he set the single season record for tackles with 197. He helped lead the Tigers to the second round of the 1986 Division I-AA playoffs and was selected as Defensive MVP in 1987 and 1988.

Following completion of his bachelor's degree, Reed entered the coaching profession. He held positions at Prairie View A&M (Linebackers, 2001), Bethune-Cookman University (Linebackers, 92-95), and Seabreeze High School (DC, 96-00) in Daytona Beach, Fla. Within those positions he coached five first-team all-conference linebackers and a pair of All-Americans.

Before coming to TSU, Reed previously coached at East Texas

Baptist College (00-03) in his hometown of Marshall, Texas. He served as defensive coordinator for East Texas Baptist, which launched its football program during the 2000 season.

The 2002 Texas Baptist defense ranked second in their conference in scoring defense and third in rushing defense. The team did not allow points in either the first or third periods through the first eight games in 2002.

Reed is the son of Robert Reed, Jr., an All-America offensive guard for the Tigers in 1963 and 1964 who later played professionally for the Washington Redskins.

Reed is the university's Fellowship of Christian Athletes representative and in 2009 he participated in the NCAA Football Coaches Academy. He and his wife, Tamika, are the parents of our children, Terry, Takara, Briah, and Marcel.

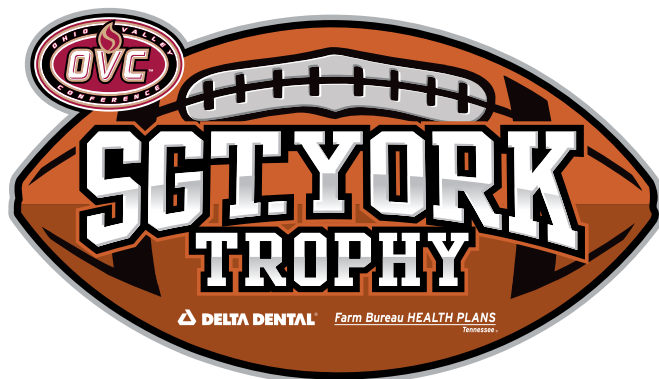

In July 2007, the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the Sergeant York Trophy which goes to the winner of the quadrangular season football series between the four Ohio Valley Conference schools located in the state of Tennessee – Austin Peay State University, University of Tennessee at Martin, Tennessee State University and Tennessee Technological University.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972.

In a close race, Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award, finishing with identical 2-1 records in 2007. Tennessee State took the trophy home thanks to a one-point victory in overtime over the Governors; that game was decided by a block extra point by NFL First Round Draft Pick Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie. The Tigers repeated as champions in 2008, winning all three of its Sgt. York games.

The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. As a corporal in the 2nd battalion, 328th Infantry, in the Battle of the Meuse River-Argonne (Oct. 8, 1918), York and seven other soldiers captured 132 prisoners, was promoted to sergeant and received the Distinguished Service Cross, the French Croix de Guerre, the French Legion of Honor, the Croce di Guerra of Italy and the War Medal of Montenegro. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor.

Following the war, York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. (located in north central Tennessee, 55 miles

northeast of Cookeville) where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. In 1927, he established the Alvin C. York Institute after spending several years raising money for the school which opened as a private institution. That school was established, in part, to provide educational opportunities denied to the boys and girls of Fentress County. In 1937, the Institute became a state special school after an appeal to the Tennessee State Legislature. The school, located in Jamestown, Tenn., is still in operation today.

York died on Sept. 2, 1964 and the foundation which he helped establish in 1920 – The Sergeant York Patriotic Foundation – was dormant for many years. The Foundation was re-established by Lipscomb Davis, Jr. in 1992 and is currently run by Sgt. York's grandson Gerald (U.S. Army Colonel, Retired). York's papers are archived by Michael E. Birdwell, Ph.D., who is an associate professor of history at Tennessee Technological University, one of the four institutions that will compete for the yearly honor.

After the completion of the football season, the Sergeant York Trophy is awarded to the institution with the best head-to-head record in the match-ups with their fellow Tennessee schools. In the event of a tie, the award is shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is presented to the winning institution annually at the Pepsi Celebration of Champions which is hosted each spring by the Nashville Sports Council. The event was created in 1999 and salutes amateur and professional sports in Tennessee.
