### NOTES

- This is the 28th meeting between Tennessee State and Southeast Missouri.
- Tennessee State leads the series 14-13.
- The Big Blue is 8-3 in Nashville.
- SEMO won last year's contest, 32-13 in the Music City.

#### Last Meeting

- Tennessee State fell 32-13 to Southeast Missouri at Hale Stadium.
- The Tigers' run game was held to 83 yards on 28 carries.
- Included was a Te'kerrick Robertson 20 yard touchdown run to put TSU on the board in the third quarter, making the score 22-7.
- The Robertson run was set up by a spectacular one-handed catch by Steven Newbold.
- Cameron Rosendahl's 34 yard pass was hauled in by a leaping Newbold who split two defenders extended his arm to make a finger tip catch at the Redhawks 20.
- The catch was the No. 2 play on Sports Center's Top 10 that evening.
- Despite playing only one half, Jahsun Bryant led the defense with a game high nine tackles, six solo, one sack and 1.5 for loss.
- The linebacker left the contest just before halftime with a season ending injury.
- Dajour Nesbeth pulled down an and added two pass breakups.
- The Redhawks scored on 7-of-11 drives, finishing with 498 total net yards, 225 rushing.
- SEMO kicker Kendrick Tiller made four field goals and three PATs.

#### Head Coach Rod Reed

- Coach Reed is in his 11th season at the helm of the Tigers and holds a 58-60 record.
- Only two coaches have produced more wins at TSU.
- John Merritt claimed 174 victories in his 20 years (1963-83) for a .806 winning percentage (174-35-7), while Harry Kean spent 10 years in charge of TSU from 1944-54 and compiled a 93-15-3 record (.838).
- TSU is 9-2 in season openers under Rod Reed, including a 17-10 win at FBS opponent Georgia State in 2017.
- The loss to Austin Peay was the first opening day defeat since a 12-9 decision to Bethune-Cookman in 2013.

#### Tennessee State

- The Tigers are coming off a 24-10 defeat at the hands of Tennessee Tech.
- TSU was limited to 51 plays and gained 159 yards on the day.
- Antonio Zita kicked a 51-yard field goal late in the second quarter to send the Big Blue to the break trailing 14-3.
- Jalen Rouse opened the second half with a 40 yard kickoff return.
- Despite the good field position, TSU came up empty as Zita's 34 yard attempt sailed wide left.
- With the Golden Eagles ahead late in the contest, Deveon Bryant reached the end zone on a 13 yard scamper to cut the lead to 24-10.
- The Defense registered 13 tackles for loss, including three sacks.
- Nyle Love posted a game high 10 tackles, seven solo and one for loss.
- Freshman Chris Walker led with four TFLs, tying for third at TSU since TFLs became an official stat.
- Zita has now connected on five field goals from 50-plus yards.
- The kicker ranks first in the nation averaging 2.17 field goals per game.
- Devon Starling leads the OVC averaging 90.7 yards per game and ranks 21st nationally.
- Davaon Hawkins has amassed 9.0 tackles for loss, 5.0 sacks, four quarterback hurries, forced two fumbles, recovered one and is second on the team with 31 tackles.
- Hawkins leads the OVC averaging 1.3 tackles for loss and 0.83 sacks per game.

**Series Information:** This is the 28th meeting with the Tigers holding a 14-13 advantage. The teams first met in 1991, with SEMO earning a 37-34 win. The Tigers gained their first win in the series a year later (1992), 37-27. The Redhawks recorded the next three wins, before the Tigers went on a five game win streak. SEMO won the meeting in 2014, 28-21, snapping a three game run by the Tigers. TSU bounced back with a 32-31 victory in Cape Girardeau in 2016 and a 23-20 win at Hale Stadium in 2017. The Redhawks have won two in a row against the Tigers for the first time since the 2002 and 2003 campaigns.

## TENNESSEE STATE VS. SOUTHEAST MISSOURI (APR. 11, 2021)

### Scoring Streak

- Tennessee State has scored a point in 76 consecutive games.
- The last time the Tigers were shutout was on Nov. 2, 2013 at Eastern Kentucky (44-0)
- The streak is the second longest current streak in the OVC.
- Jacksonville State has scored in 101 consecutive games dating back to a 23-0 loss at Florida on Nov. 17, 2012.
- The longest all-time streak at the FCS level belongs to Montana with 406 dating back to 1989.

### Another Ladder to Climb

- Antonio Zita has entered the TSU career scoring Top 10.
- Zita scored four points at Tennessee Tech, giving the junior 200 points for his career.
- The total moves him into eighth all-time at TSU passing Larry Watkins who posted 198 points from 1978-81.
- Earlier in the season, the kicker moved past Carlos Jones (1982-84) who finished his career with 172 points.
- Zita scored eight points in the Tigers 26-24 win over UT Martin, giving him 196 career points.
- The kicker climbed to ninth on the scoring list, passing former wide receiver C.J. Johnson (2000-03) who amassed 192 points.
- Eric Benson is the next kicker on the list in seventh with 232.

### "The Hole"

- Tennessee State will play home games this spring in Hale Stadium.
- TSU is one of the few teams in the nation that splits games between two home sites.
- This season is the first since 1998 to play all home games in "the Hole".
- The Tigers used the on-campus stadium from 1953-1998 before moving into Nissan Stadium in 1999.
- TSU returned to Hale in 2012 and has gone 10-9 during this time.
- The Big Blue dropped all four games in Hale Stadium in 2019.
- In total, TSU is 183-66-5 at home all-time.

### Playing Behind the Line

- The defense, made 13 stops behind the line of scrimmage, including three sacks, at Tennessee Tech.
- The previous best this season was 12 Tackles for Loss and three sacks in week one at Austin Peay.
- The top game in 2019 for TFLs was 10 against Eastern Illinois.
- The last time TSU finished with 13 TFLs came on Nov. 7, 2015 against Murray State.
- This year, the Big Blue picked up another eight stops in the backfield against Eastern Illinois, led by Davoan Hawkins 3.5.
- The Tigers tallied six tackles for loss against UT Martin.
- TSU produced six stops for loss at Murray State, including two by Hawkins.
- Hawkins is averaging 1.3 per game which is first in the OVC and 50th in the FCS.
- The Big Blue made seven stops behind the line of scrimmage versus Jacksonville State without recording a sack.

### A New Workhorse

- Devon Starling has exploded onto the scene for the Tigers after spending the first two weeks of the season as number two on the depth chart.
- Starling has earned starts in the Tigers last four games.
- The redshirt-freshman has carried the ball 105 times for 544, but was held to just 30 yards on 11 touches at Tennessee Tech.
- Starling is averaging 5.2 yards per carry and 90.7 per game.
- The running back leads the OVC and ranks 21st in the FCS in yards per game and is fourth, 11th in the nation, in total yards.
- His amount leads all freshman runners who have played games in the spring only.
- The Memphis transfer made 26 attempts against UT Martin and finished with 134 yards and one touchdown.
- The 100 yard outing was his second consecutive in his brief career as a Tiger.
- For his efforts, Starling was named BOXTOROW National Player of the Week and OVC Newcomer of the Week.
- His 149 yard performance at Murray State was the first 100-yard game for a Tiger since Nov. 3, 2018.
- On that day, TeKendrick Roberson and Earl Harrison both rushed for 100 yards at Southeast Missouri.
- In five games this season, Starling is over two-thirds of the way to Roberson's full slate total from 2019.
- In 12 games a season ago, Roberson rushed for 750 yards on 176 touches, for a 4.3 per rush and 62.5 per game average.
- In 2018, Roberson finished with 100 carries for 527 yards (5.3 per rush, 58.6 per game).
- The last Tiger to average over 100 yards per game was Trabis Ward in 2012.
- Ward ran for 1,422 yards on 309 carries in 11 games, averaging 4.6 yards per rush and 129.3 per game.

### Meet You at the Quarterback

- The Big Blue collected three sacks at Tennessee Tech to bring this seasons total to 15 sacks for 88 yards lost.
- The amount matches the Tigers' total from the 12-game 2019 season.
- The TSU defense recorded four sacks against Eastern Illinois.
- The Panthers had allowed just two over the first two games of the season.
- Nate Sutton led the way with 2.0, ahead of Davoan Hawkins 1.5 and Terray Jones' 0.5.
- In the opener, the Tigers had three sacks against APSU.
- The Big Blue racked up three sacks against UT Martin.
- Freshman Emmanuel Baez earned his first two collegiate sacks, while Hawkins tallied his team leading fourth.
- Hawkins picked up the lone sack at Murray State and leads the OVC with 0.83 per game.
- A season ago, the defense collected two sacks in each of the final four games.
- The last time the Tigers registered four sacks in an outing was versus Tennessee Tech on Oct. 20, 2018.

## GAME NOTES

## TENNESSEE STATE VS. SOUTHEAST MISSOURI (APR. 11, 2021)

### Fresh Starts

- The 2021 spring season has seen 20 Tigers earn their first start.
- Week six was the first time this season the Big Blue did have a player earn their first start.
- For the first five weeks multiple players earned their initial starts.
- Freshmen Detoye Adewole and Chris Walker lined up on opposite ends of the defensive line against UT Martin.
- Freshman Zaire Thornton and junior transfer Benjamin Johnson picked up starts at Murray State and joined the ranks of Tigers who earned their first starts.
- Sophomore David Dorsey and transfer Nate Sutton received the nod versus Eastern Illinois.
- Against Jacksonville State, three offensive players and two defensive gained the nod.
- True freshmen Kenyon Andrews and Ahmad Nelson picked up their first starts, along with transfers Isaiah Green and Brandon Jones.
- Sophomore Dayron Johnson has played in 12 games for the Tigers before earning his first start.
- In all, 36 players have seen the field for the first time this season.
- Against Austin Peay, six Tigers on offense gained their first start.
- Deveon Bryant, Cam Wych, Vincent Perry, Sean McMoore and Robert Lacey all gained starts in their first action for the Tigers.
- Shawn McColley earned his first start for the Big Blue after playing in nine contests in each of the last two seasons.
- Transfers Curt McDonald, Davaon Hawkins and Tadarrius Patterson each gained their first start at Austin Peay.

### One Leg After Another

- Antonio Zita is another in long line of productive kickers at Tennessee State.
- TSU has used just five players from 2001-21 to handle the majority of the kicking duties.
- Joey Hudak was the Big Blue kicker for four seasons from 2001-2004 until Eric Benson took over for the next four campaigns, 2005-08.
- After Benson graduated, the Tigers only attempted six field goals during the 2009 season.
- Jamin Godfrey came to TSU and took over the kicking duties from 2010-13 ahead of Lane Clark who was the primary kicker for four seasons (2014-18) before passing the torch to Zita.
- The five rank as the top five kickers in field goals made in program history.
- Hudak left as the career leader and was surpassed by Benson who was then passed by Godfrey.
- Clark is second on the list, but holds nine of the top 18 longest field goals at TSU.
- Zita is one field goal behind Clark.

### Quarterbacking the Tigers

- Isaiah Green has earned the start the last five games for the Tigers.
- Deveon Bryant shared time with Green against UT Martin and at Tennessee Tech.
- Bryant has made the most of his opportunities rushing for a 32 yard touchdown against the Skyhawks and a 13 yarder at TTU.
- Against the Golden Eagles, Green went 8-for-10 for 48 yards, while Bryant finished 5-of-15 for 41 yards and an interception.
- Green improved after game two, going 21-of-32 for 257 yards while rushing eight times for 28 yards against Eastern Illinois.
- The junior followed up the outing going 15-of-29 for 202 yards, while rushing for 18 yards at Murray State.
- The transfer took every offensive snap in game two of the season against Jacksonville State and was 15-of-31 for 145 yards, a touchdown and an interception.
- Deveon Bryant earned the start in the opener at Austin Peay.
- The action was the first for the redshirt sophomore at TSU.
- Bryant played deep into the third quarter and finished the game completing 4-of-13 passes for 61 yards and a touchdown.
- Bryant added 16 yards rushing on five carries.
- David Johnson entered in the third quarter and played just one snap, throwing an interception on his lone play.
- Isaiah Green entered for the Tigers to start the fourth quarter with the Tigers trailing 27-10.
- Green led the Big Blue to 10 points while completing 10 passes on 18 attempts for 173 yards and a touchdown.
- The junior transfer gave TSU a chance to win on the final drive, starting at his own 14 yard line with 1:32 to play.
- Green completed passes of 15, 20 and 31 yards to move the offense down to the AP 24 with two seconds remaining.
- The Tigers final chance for a comeback fell short on the final pass.

### Jar It Loose

- The Tigers have forced 10 fumbles and recovered three through five games in the 2021 spring season.
- This year's squad has forced more fumbles than the entire 12-game 2019 when the Big Blue jarred six balls loose.
- The three recoveries have surpassed the two from a season ago.
- The 2019 totals were the lowest in TSU history.
- In 2018, the defense caused eight fumbles and recovered three.
- The 2017 season was the last time the Tigers jumped on more than three fumbles.
- The 2017 squad recovered six of the 16 forced fumbles they caused.
- The Tigers forced a program best 41 fumbles in 1983.
- The 1977 squad recovered a program best 22.

### Filling Some Big Shoes

- In 2019, Chris Rowland finished his senior campaign with 2,110 all-purpose yards.

- Rowland, now with the Atlanta Falcons, and his 175.83 all-purpose yards per game led the OVC and ranked second in FCS play.

- In five games, Dayron Johnson is averaging 101.4 all-purpose yards per game, ranking second in the OVC.

- The sophomore is currently second in the conference and is eighth in the country averaging 11.3 yards on punt returns and is first in the OVC, 11th nationally, at 25.8 yards per kickoff return.

- Johnson went for 62 yards on two kickoff returns and had one punt return for 19 yards at Murray State.

- The local product also hauled in four passes for 80 yards and had one rush for eight yards, totaling 169 all-purpose yards against the Racers.

- The receiver/return specialist was held to 13 yards on one kickoff return and 10 yards on one punt return against Eastern Illinois.

- Johnson was held to 50 total yards against Jacksonville State after compiling 242 yards in his first game as the primary return specialist at Austin Peay.

- The sophomore's 242.0 all-purpose yards per game after week one ranked first in the nation and the OVC.

- Johnson returned three kickoffs for 96 yards and three punts for 44 yards.

- The wide receiver also pulled down four passes for 95 yards and added another seven rushing on two carries.

- Johnson led the OVC and ranked third in FCS in both kickoff return average (32.0) and punt return average (14.7).

### Having a Voice

- Junior Raymond Horton was selected to serve on the NCAA Division I Football Oversight Committee Student-Athlete Connection Group.

- The defensive lineman is one of two student-athletes from the Ohio Valley Conference.

- The group's goal is to gather broad-based feedback from D-I football student-athletes on multiple issues. The topics include COVID-19 health and safety measures, transfer issues, name, image and likeness topics and social justice issues.

- The committee will meet quarterly to discuss issues and provide feedback.

- Horton is joined by Tennessee Tech's Seth Carlisle and Eastern Illinois head coach Adam Cushing, who is the FCS level head coach representative.

### Location Breakdown

- The 2021 Tigers are represented by 11 states.

- Of the 91 players on the squad, 33 hail from Tennessee, while 19 come from Florida and 18 from Georgia.

- Alabama is represented by eight players, while four are from Illinois and two each from Mississippi, Texas and Pennsylvania.

- Hawaii and Virginia each have one athlete.

### OVC Honors

- Devon Starling became the second Tiger to gain OVC honors for his performance against UT Martin.

- Starling rushed for 134 including a 65-yard touchdown run to claim a share of the Newcomer of the Week award.

- Antonio Zita earned back-to-back Specialist of the Week honors in weeks two and three.

- Zita drilled kicks from 51, 62 and 35 against Eastern Illinois.

- The first was a career long, which lasted for just over two quarters when the junior matched the OVC record and fell one yard short of the FCS record.

- The shortest of the three kicks was converted as time expired to give the Tigers a 21-20 win.

- The kicker claimed the first honors for TSU in the 2021 spring season.

- Zita was named Specialist of the Week on Mar. 9 for his performance against Jacksonville State.

- The junior scored 10 points with three field goals and an extra point.

- Zita connected from 36, 41 and 47 yards.

- In 2019, the Tigers earned Ohio Valley Conference Weekly Honors on seven occasions.

### Rebounding From Slow Start

- In the season opener, Austin Peay gained 186 yards on its first four plays and scored three touchdowns.
- The Govs averaged 46.5 yards per play and 62.0 yards per rush over the first eight minutes of the game.
- Over the final three and a half quarters the Big Blue held APSU to 182 yards on 55 plays for an average of 3.3 yards per play.
- Rushing wise, Austin Peay rushed 38 times for 64 yards the rest of the way, averaging 1.7 yards per carry.
- An even deeper look shows the Tigers holding the Govs to 22 yards on the ground on 31 rushes for the final three quarters, an average of 0.7 yards per run.

### Snaps To It

- True freshman Carson Buchanan has taken over as the long snapper for punts and field goals.
- Buchanan takes over a spot that has been manned by three players since 2010.

### Pushing 50

- Kaleb Mosley was named to the Preseason All-OVC team after leading the conference in 2019 averaging 42.2 yards per punt.
- Mosley was named as one of 22 candidates on the Augusta Sports Council preseason FCS Punter of the Year Award watch list.
- The list is based on the 2019 watch list, 2019 honors and 2020 preseason recognition.
- Mosley recorded punts of 50-plus yards in seven consecutive games dating back to the final game of the 2018 season through the first six games of 2019.
- The junior booted a 57 yard punt at Jacksonville State in the final game of the streak, before missing the next two games due to surgery.
- After his return, Mosley closed the season with a punt of 45 or more yards over the final four games, including a 58-yard boot at UT Martin.
- The punt was the third longest of his career, behind a 64-yarder against Mississippi Valley State (8-31-19) and a 61-yarder at Eastern Kentucky (9-28-19).
- The 64 yard punt is the eighth longest in program history.

## Welcome Back

- Antonio Zita returns for his third season with the Tigers after deciding to transfer to NCAA D-II West Florida.
- Zita comes back after one semester away from Tennessee State.
- The junior regained his honor as a Preseason All-OVC selection.
- As a sophomore, the kicker set a single season program record with 20 field goals.
- The mark also tied for fifth best in OVC history.
- Zita finished 2019 with a .833 field goal percentage (20-for-24), which led the OVC and ranked sixth in the FCS.
- Zita earned an honorable mention spot on the HERO Sports Sophomore All-America team.

## Condensed Schedule

- Due to the pandemic the 2020 season was reduced to a conference only spring season.
- The schedule consists of a seven game round robin facing each team in the OVC with the exception of Eastern Kentucky.
- The Colonels opted out after playing nine games in the fall.
- In 2018, the Tigers played just nine games due to two cancellations due to weather.
- The Southern Heritage Classic versus Jackson State was cancelled due to lightning.
- The following week, the Tigers game at Hampton was cancelled due to Hurricane Florence.
- The seven game slate is the smallest for TSU since 1957.
- The Big Blue under the direction of Howard Gentry finished the '57 campaign at 5-0-1.

## TSU vs. HBCUs

- The 2021 spring season will be the first time Tennessee State has not faced a Historically Black College and University (HBCU).
- Tennessee State University holds a 399-143-19 record against other HBCUs, good for a .728 winning percentage.
- The Tigers finished 1-2 versus HBCUs in 2019.
- Since taking over in 2010, Rod Reed holds a 22-6 against HBCUs for a winning percentage of .786.
- TSU's most wins against D-I HBCU opponents are: Florida A&M (29), Jackson State (28) and Southern (27).

## Where they Stand

- Offensive Coordinator Shannon Harris will call plays from upstairs.
- Harris will be joined by tight ends coach Antonio Bradford.
- First year defensive coordinator Justin Roberts will be in the box.
- Defensive backs coach Ahmaad Smith will join Roberts upstairs.
- Joining Head Coach Rod Reed on the sidelines will be offensive line coach Russ Ehrenfeld, running backs coach Kevin Mashack, wide receiver coach Andrew Bather, defensive line coach Ken Amato and linebackers coach Rico Council.
- Council also holds the position of Special Teams coordinator.
- Head Strength and Conditioning coach, Tyler Miles will be on the sideline and hold the role of "get back" coach.

## Black College Hall of Fame Nominee

- Joe '747' Adams was named a finalist for The Black College Hall of Fame for the sixth consecutive year.
- Adams was one of 22 players and three coaches on the list.
- The Class of 2021 was announced on Nov. 19 with the TSU legend missing out once again.
- Adams ranks second at TSU in career passing yards with 8,653.
- The Gulfport, Miss., native tossed a Tennessee State single season best 30 touchdowns in 1980 and 75 in his career (1977-80).
- Adams was drafted by the San Francisco 49ers in the 12th round of the 1981 NFL Draft.
- He continued his professional career by playing three seasons in the Canadian Football League with the Saskatchewan Roughriders, Toronto Argonauts and Ottawa Rough Riders.
- Six TSU greats have been previously inducted. Eldridge Dickey and Claude Humphrey entered in 2012, Joe Gilliam, Jr., Ed 'Too Tall' Jones and John Merritt were enshrined in 2013 and Richard Dent was the latest entrant in 2015.
- Robert Porcher, spent two seasons at TSU, redshirting in 1987 before playing for the Big Blue in 1988, was a 2017 inductee.

- On defense, Tadarrius Patterson, Nate Sutton, Emmanuel Baez, Detoye Adewole, Chris Walker and Davoan Hawkins look to make an impact in the front seven, along with linebackers Kendall Johnson and Ahmad Nelson.
- Freshman Kenyon Andrews looks to provide depth in the backfield.

### Tigers in the NFL

- Five former Tigers were in NFL camps this season.
- **Anthony Levine** spent his 10th season with Baltimore.
- Levine sat out week six of the season due to injury snapping a streak of consecutive games played at 117.
- The streak which began in 2013 was the third longest active run for the Ravens behind punter Sam Koch and kicker Justin Tucker.
- Levine is fifth on the Ravens all-time streak behind Koch, Turner, Jarret Johnson (129) and Joe Flacco (122).
- **Terrell Bonds** played in four games for the Ravens before his season was cut short by an injury in week against the New England Patriots.
- The cornerback made six tackles and appeared in 84 defensive snaps.
- Bonds registered his first NFL tackle against the Pittsburgh Steelers and earned his first start versus the Indianapolis Colts.
- Bonds signed a reserve/futures contract with the Miami Dolphins which will take effect in March.
- **Chris Rowland** spent most of the season as a protected practice squad player and was activated for the final two games of the season where he served as a return specialist.
- **Lachavious Simmons** spent half the season on the Chicago Bears practice squad before being added to the roster.
- The offensive lineman was inactive for the final seven games of the season.
- Lineman **Chidi Okeke** worked out with the Green bay Packers prior to the start of the season and worked out with the Jacksonville Jaguars in Week 10.

Rod Reed enters his eighth season at the helm of the Tennessee State football program after being named head coach on December 18, 2009. He served as the associate head coach and defensive coordinator during the 2009 season.

Reed experienced immediate success as a head coach, leading the Tigers to a win in his debut game, 27-14, over Alabama A&M on Sept. 4, 2010 in the John Merritt Classic. He also broke an eight-game losing streak to Florida A&M, downing the Rattlers, 29-18, in the Atlanta Classic. Reed coached six players to All-OVC Teams including safety Eugene Clifford who also was a Sports Network, Phil Steele and BOXTOROW All-American.

The Tigers increased their win total in their second season under Reed and finished the 2011 season on a hot streak, winning four of their last six games. The stretch included a, 42-40, upset win at No. 19 ranked Tennessee Tech on Oct. 15. Reed produced even more All-OVC players in year two, as seven made postseason squads. Two more defenders garnered All-American honors under Reed's tutelage in linebacker Rico Council and Joseph Wylie. He also helped Lamar Divens and Sidney Tarver ink NFL contracts.

The Big Blue continued its success in 2012 by rattling off seven straight victories to open the season. The Tigers finished the year with an 8-3 record, its best since 2001. The performance earned TSU HBCU Program of the Year honors by HBCU Huddle. Several players earned postseason accolades including running back Trabis Ward who was named to the College Sports All-American Team after running for 1,460 yards and 15 touchdowns. Three more Tigers were Sheridan All-Americans including Sherman Carter who signed an NFL deal with fellow offensive lineman Rogers Gaines following suit.

Reed turned in his finest season to date in 2013, as the Tigers finished 10-4 and won a FCS Playoff Game for the first time since 1986. It capped an impressive run in which Reed improved his club's win total by at least two in each of his first four campaigns. TSU won its first HBCU National Championship since 1982 and the team's shutout win over Butler in the first round of the playoffs was the first victory for the OVC in post-season play in nearly 30 years. A school record 12 Tigers were chosen to the league's all-conference teams at season's end and Kadeem Edwards (143rd) and Demetrius Rhaney (250th) were selected in the NFL Draft.

In 2014, Reed's defense ranked inside the top-10 for the third

straight season. Middle linebacker Nick Thrasher tallied 128 stops on the season, which was sixth-most in a single-season in school history and the highest total for a Tiger since 1991. Thrasher also moved up to second-place in tackles in the TSU record book over the course of the season, finishing with 358. Quarterback Mike German threw for 2,846 yards on the year, helping him break the 34 year old school-mark with 8,664 career yards.

After breaking a streak of three consecutive non-losing seasons in 2015, the Tigers bounced back to finish 7-4 in 2016. TSU re-emerged as one of the top teams in the OVC under Reed with nine all-conference players and six All-Americans. The offense led the OVC in points scored and finished second in total offense. Cornerback Ezra Robinson and offensive lineman Jessamen Dunker both earned First Team All-OVC selections, All-American status and were invited to play in the Reese's Senior Bowl. The duo also participated in the NFL combine and signed free agent contracts.

Reed has coached a total of 28 All-Americans and 62 All-OVC Players in his seven seasons as a head coach and has staked a 43-37 record.

He began coaching at TSU in 2003 and served as the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach. At the conclusion of the season in which Reed returned to the TSU sideline, the Tigers led the OVC in total defense for the first time in school history. The defense accomplished the same feat in 2008 finishing at the top of the OVC in total defense.

A keen recruiter as an assistant, Reed was responsible for bringing several notable key players into the TSU program. Reed is noted for recruiting Javarris Williams (2009 seven-round draft pick, Kansas City Chiefs), Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie (2008 first-round draft pick, Arizona Cardinals), Shaun Richardson, Lamar Divens (Baltimore Ravens, 2008) and Cornelius Lewis. He has also coached All-America and professional player, Lamar Landrom (Jacksonville Jaguars).

Reed was a four-year letter winner for the TSU Tigers from 1984 - 1988. He capped off his career by being named Sheridan All-America his senior season. He set the Tiger record for career tackles from his linebacker slot and in 1987, he set the single season record for tackles with 197. He helped lead the Tigers to the second round of the 1986 Division I-AA playoffs and was selected as Defensive MVP in 1987 and 1988. Following completion of his bachelor's degree, Reed entered the coaching profession. He held positions at Prairie View A&M (Linebackers, 2001), Bethune-Cookman University (Linebackers, 92-95), and Seabreeze High School (DC, 96-00) in Daytona Beach, Fla. Within those positions he coached five first-team all-conference linebackers and a pair of All-Americans.

Before coming to TSU, Reed previously coached at East Texas

Baptist College (00-03) in his hometown of Marshall, Texas. He served as defensive coordinator for East Texas Baptist, which launched its football program during the 2000 season.

The 2002 Texas Baptist defense ranked second in their conference in scoring defense and third in rushing defense. The team did not allow points in either the first or third periods through the first eight games in 2002.

Reed is the son of Robert Reed, Jr., an All-America offensive guard for the Tigers in 1963 and 1964 who later played professionally for the Washington Redskins.

Reed is the university's Fellowship of Christian Athletes representative and in 2009 he participated in the NCAA Football Coaches Academy. He and his wife, Tamika, are the parents of our children, Terry, Takara, Briah, and Marcel.

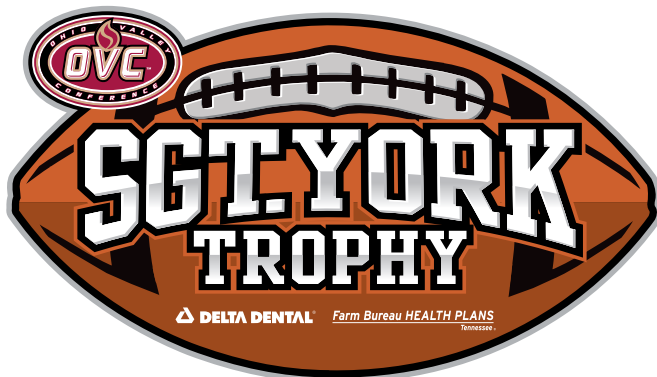

In July 2007, the Nashville Sports Council and the Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of the Sergeant York Trophy which goes to the winner of the quadrangular season football series between the four Ohio Valley Conference schools located in the state of Tennessee – Austin Peay State University, University of Tennessee at Martin, Tennessee State University and Tennessee Technological University.

The award is only the second traveling trophy that involves more than two teams in college sports; the other is the Commander in Chief's Trophy which has been contested between Air Force, Army and Navy annually since 1972.

In a close race, Tennessee State and Austin Peay shared the inaugural award, finishing with identical 2-1 records in 2007. Tennessee State took the trophy home thanks to a one-point victory in overtime over the Governors; that game was decided by a block extra point by NFL First Round Draft Pick Dominique Rodgers-Cromartie. The Tigers repeated as champions in 2008, winning all three of its Sgt. York games.

The award is named in honor of Alvin C. York, the most noted Soldier of World War I. As a corporal in the 2<sup>nd</sup> battalion, 328<sup>th</sup> Infantry, in the Battle of the Meuse River-Argonne (Oct. 8, 1918), York and seven other soldiers captured 132 prisoners, was promoted to sergeant and received the Distinguished Service Cross, the French Croix de Guerre, the French Legion of Honor, the Croce di Guerra of Italy and the War Medal of Montenegro. Upon his return to the United States in 1919, he was bestowed the Congressional Medal of Honor.

Following the war, York returned his home in Pall Mall, Tenn. (located in north central Tennessee, 55 miles

northeast of Cookeville) where he dedicated his life to improving education and facilitating educational opportunities for children in the state of Tennessee. In 1927, he established the Alvin C. York Institute after spending several years raising money for the school which opened as a private institution. That school was established, in part, to provide educational opportunities denied to the boys and girls of Fentress County. In 1937, the Institute became a state special school after an appeal to the Tennessee State Legislature. The school, located in Jamestown, Tenn., is still in operation today.

York died on Sept. 2, 1964 and the foundation which he helped establish in 1920 – The Sergeant York Patriotic Foundation – was dormant for many years. The Foundation was re-established by Lipscomb Davis, Jr. in 1992 and is currently run by Sgt. York's grandson Gerald (U.S. Army Colonel, Retired). York's papers are archived by Michael E. Birdwell, Ph.D., who is an associate professor of history at Tennessee Technological University, one of the four institutions that will compete for the yearly honor.

After the completion of the football season, the Sergeant York Trophy is awarded to the institution with the best head-to-head record in the match-ups with their fellow Tennessee schools. In the event of a tie, the award is shared; however, the previous winner will retain the trophy if they are part of the tie. If the tie is between two other institutions, the trophy will go to the institution that has gone the most seasons without winning the trophy.

The award is presented to the winning institution annually at the Pepsi Celebration of Champions which is hosted each spring by the Nashville Sports Council. The event was created in 1999 and salutes amateur and professional sports in Tennessee.
